Tests and Awards

Introduction to Quarry – Open to all dogs. Nonregular class; dogs do not earn a title in this class. Qualifiers receive a flat ribbon.

Junior Earthdog – Open to all dogs except dogs that have received a Senior qualifying leg. Qualifiers receive a flat ribbon.

Senior Earthdog – Open to all dogs that have earned a JE before the close of entries. Qualifiers receive a flat ribbon.

Master Earthdog – Open to all dogs that have earned an SE before close of entries. Qualifiers receive a flat ribbon.

New Titles – CRCTC offers a water bucket with plaque to dogs that complete a title at a CRCTC test.

Junior Handlers

Notice to Exhibitors

- Earthdog tests are held rain or shine. Oregon weather is unpredictable. Bring both shade and rain cover for you and your dog.
- Dogs may enter only one regular class. Dogs with Master titles may enter more than one regular class. Dogs need not qualify in Intro to enter the Junior Earthdog class.
- The running order will be posted and followed using AKC rules. This includes pre-entries.
- Dogs must be held on a short leash (6' or less) and under control while on the test grounds, including buildings, roadway, parking, and areas leading to and from the test dens. No off-lead dogs or unlocked flexi-leads allowed on site during test hours.
- Dogs are not allowed within 100 feet of the test areas.
- As bitches in season are not eligible, please leave them at home or confine them to your setup.
- This test is being held on private property. Please honor posted signs, notices, and any requests or directions from the site owner.
- Pick up after your dog. No exceptions!
- If, because of riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of CRCTC, it is impossible to begin or complete these tests, no refund of entries will be given.
- A \$25 fee will be charged for any checks returned for insufficient funds.

Directions To The Test Site

24491 S Larkin Road, Beavercreek OR (503) 632-2476

Heading either South bound or North bound on I-205:

Take exit 10 for OR-213 toward Mollala/Oregon City.

Follow OR-213 for about 3 miles.

Turn Left at Beavercreek Road; follow Beavercreek Road about 3.7 miles.

In downtown Beavercreek, Beavercreek Road makes a 90 degree left turn at the 4-way intersection; make the Left turn to stay on Beavercreek Road.

Continue about 5 more miles on Beavercreek Road.

Turn Right at S Larkin Road.

There will be a sign on the telephone pole beside the driveway for 24491 – turn Right down the LONG driveway just in front of the telephone pole with the sign. The driveway splits into 2 driveways. There is a gate to the right-hand driveway – this is the neighbors, please do not disturb them.

The driveway eventually turns to the left. There will be a parking czar providing directions, but in general, parking will be at right angles to the driveway past that left turn, with overflow parking into two fields that will be marked as needed.

Parking

- Day parking is at the direction of the site host and test committee. *Do not block exit aisles with your car or setup.*
- Limited RV parking is available (no elec). Contact Tom Quarles at 503-632-2476 prior to July 25. Camping allowed in the pasture – contact Tom Quarles to confirm availability.

ELIGIBILITY: Dogs six months of age or older and registered with the American Kennel Club are eligible to participate in earthdog tests, as are spayed and neutered dogs. The following breeds are classified as eligible to participate in earthdog tests: Dachshunds, Australian Terriers, Bedlington Terriers, Border Terriers, Cairn Terriers, Cesky Terriers, Dandie Dinmont Terriers, Glen of Imaal Terriers, Fox Terriers (Smooth and Wirehaired), Lakeland Terriers, Manchester Terriers, Miniature Bull Terriers, Miniature Schnauzers, Norfolk Terriers, Norwich Terriers, Parson Russell Terriers, Rat Terriers, Scottish Terriers, Sealyham Terriers, Silky Terriers, Skye Terriers, Welsh Terriers and West Highland White Terriers. Dogs of an eligible breed that have been granted Indefinite Listing Privileges (ILP) are eligible to participate. A dog of an eligible breed with an acceptable foreign registration number is eligible to participate subject to Chapter 11, Section 1 of the Dog Show Rules.

Bitches in season shall not be eligible to enter the test and shall not be allowed within 100 feet of any testing area during the running of any class. Bitches in season are allowed at the general test site but should not be allowed to distract other dogs during the test hours.

The Columbia River Cairn Terrier Club and its officers assume NO responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators, or to any of their dogs or property. The club further assumes no responsibility for injuries to any child not under the control of his/her parents or guardians. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor, handler, or spectator whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviors may, at the discretion of the Test Committee, be asked to leave the Test site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
